7.1	R25/0553 – Willowbrook Barn, Woolscott Road – proposed prior approval for a steel framed building Approval is not required; no further action is necessary.	
7.2	R25/0026 – Little Leys, Moor Lane – refusal of application The application for the conversion of an agricultural building to a rural workers' dwelling was refused on 27 th June 2025.	

	Reason for refusal: The farming operations of the agricultural unit do not clearly establish an essential need for a new dwelling on the farm. Furthermore, the siting of an existing rural worker dwelling on the farm, and the availability of other existing dwellings near the application site further confirms that there is no essential need for a new dwelling at Manor Farm to provide occupation for a rural worker.
